The International Napoleonic Society will hold its eleventh International Napoleonic Congress at the Fairmont Royal York Hotel in Toronto, Canada. Toronto is a world-class destination city with lots of important history and culture, and the Royal York is the flagship hotel of the city.

The period of 1812 - 1814 was of extreme importance in both Europe and North America, and both 'wars of 1812' were linked. INS Fellows well know the events in Europe and Canadians and Americans are familiar with their own conflict, but not everyone realizes that they are tied together, not surprisingly, by their mutual ties to British policy. Because this period is so important to both continents, we encourage papers that deal with either conflict or the ties between the two conflicts.

Papers should be no more than 15 pages double-spaced, and presentations are limited to 20-30 minutes. Please complete the registration form and also include a one-page summary of your paper and a résumé. *We encourage you to submit all information via email.* When completed, please submit a printed version of your paper as well as an electronic version via email attachment or CD, using Microsoft WORD or another major word processing program. You may give us the printed version of your paper at the Congress. If requested, you will be given an opportunity to make revisions to your paper. Selected papers will be published in our journal, *Napoleonic Scholarship*, and/or on our website.

The official languages of the conference will be English and French. Hotel registration and further information will be forthcoming via email and on our website.
