Hotel Information

The conference venue is the Iberostar Parqué Central Hotel. We have negotiated a very favorable rate that will remain in effect before and after the Congress dates. However, as things are somewhat complicated in Cuba, it is necessary that your hotel booking and payment is made through the conference organizer, Luke Dalla Bona (luke@dallabona.ca). Of course you are free to make your own arrangements through a travel agent but the Parqué Central will only honor the conference rate if your booking is made through Luke.
